The Naace Self Review Framework S/R/F

The Naace Self Review Framework (SRF) helps schools to:

- \rightarrow Understand where they are in their technology strategy
- \rightarrow Plan the next stages of their technology strategy
- \rightarrow Record their progress

The SRF encourages the effective use of edtech throughout school life – not just in teaching and learning, but in administration, communication and beyond. It helps schools plan, streamline and get best value from their education technology.



The framework has been in existence for over twenty years and is regularly updated to reflect the changing scene of technology in schools. To date, over 16,000 schools have taken advantage of the SRF online system.

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NaaceMark

NaaceMark is an award available to schools that have achieved level 2 across all elements of the Naace Self Review Framework (SRF).



Schools applying for the NaaceMark school will be allocated an accredited assessor, whose judgment will be moderated by a secondary assessor. The assessor will take the time to meet a representative sample of all stakeholders in the school, from pupils to parents to governors and the SLT, and collate evidence as to how the school is using technology to advance education.

The assessor will draft a report for the school with a detailed assessment of their findings and recommendations. Pending agreement, the school is formally recognised as having achieved the NaaceMark award and will receive its certificates, the NaaceMark logo and badge. The award is valid for three years.

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'The report was clearly set out and highlighted the strengths of our school and has also given us plenty of improvement opportunities for the future. I can feedback this information to the rest of the staff and set out clear expectations within or curriculum area for the years to come. The visit was extremely useful and made me think about how I can make improve-ments and make our school even more efficient in using computing and technology to support the children within our school."



Third Millennium Learning Award

→ The Third Millennium Learning Award is the natural next step for schools that have gained the NaaceMark award.



The Third Millennium Learning Award (3MLA) celebrates schools' achievements in creating an environment and curriculum that stimulate learning experiences, making use of the opportunities presented by technology.

The application for the award involves:

- creating a five-minute video aimed at parents exemplifying the use of education technology at the school
- creating a ten-minute explanatory video which explains the school's approach to making the initial video

Two assessors are allocated by NAACE to review the entry. The guides use a 3MLA Chart to show which how technology is being used effectively across different areas of the school.

Assessors will write an independent report on the school's submission and agree an outcome.
